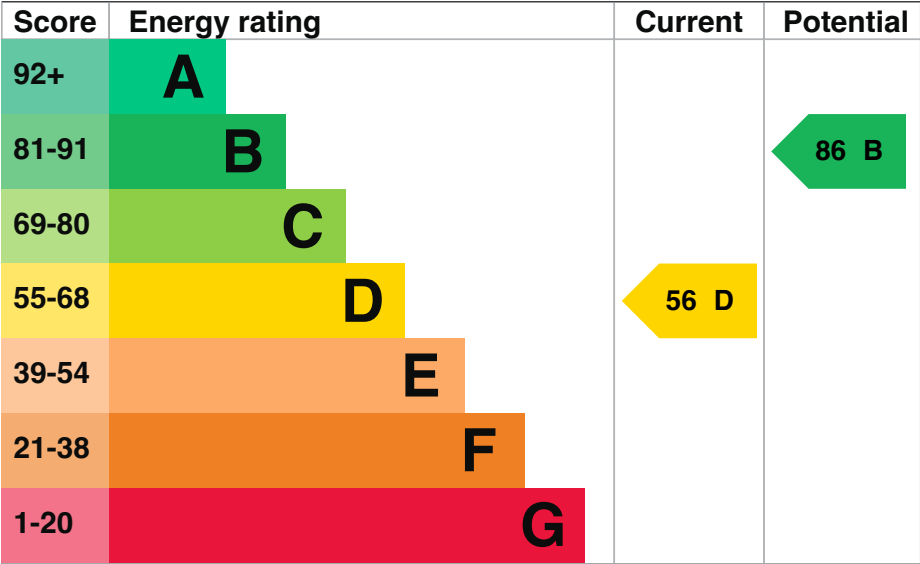

Primary energy use
