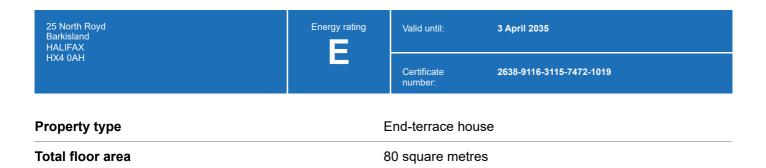
# **Energy performance certificate (EPC)**

## How this affects your energy bills
